

# Red-Eyed Tree Frog




When sleeping, if these frogs sense a predator is close, they will open their eyes really fast. Their bright red eyes will startle the predator, giving the frog time to escape!


# Scarlet Macaw


# Sloth


# White-faced Capuchin Monkey


# Tapir


# Leatherback Sea Turtles


# Basilisk


# Crocodile


# Keel-Billed Toucan
